Thank you to parents for continuing to be vigilant over **illness** within the family. It is essential that children are not sent into school if they, or a family member is unwell with Covid symptoms, diarrhoea or sickness and must not use school transport. We appreciate the social distancing at drop off and pick-up and can feel reassured that parents are following this advice in the community too. **Enclosed is a letter that we have been asked to pass on to all parents from the NHS**- please read it carefully. We have also been asked to raise awareness of the availability of <u>The NHS COVID-19</u> <u>app</u> ('the app'). This is a key part of the country's ongoing coronavirus (COVID-19) response, aiming to extend the speed, precision and reach of <u>NHS Test and Trace</u> in England, as well as NHS Test, Trace and Protect in Wales. The app will complement the overall

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service by automating some aspects of the process of contact tracing. Working together, NHS Test and Trace and the app are designed to slow the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) by alerting people who may have been exposed to infection so that they can take action. The app is available to download for anyone aged 16 and over if they choose to do so.

Class 2 will be visited by Brod, **creative sculptor**, to make willow bug houses for their bugs that they began to make last year. There will be 2 all day workshops on Thursday 22nd October and Thursday 5th November. Class 1 will have sculpture days in tandem and we'll be asking for **clean recycled materials** to be sent in from home to have an exciting array of things to build from.
